Participation in Public Forum at Engelberg Center for Health Care Reform at Brookings Institution

On January 28, 2010, the Engelberg Center for Health Care Reform at the Brookings Institution hosted a forum to discuss strategies for improving care for older Americans across a range of institutional and community-based settings.

David Dorr, MD, PI for Care Management Plus, was invited to be a panelist and was able to discuss integrating payment reforms, performance measurement, and delivery models as a next step in reforming care for older adults.

Experts and key stakeholders also examined the components of health care reform most likely to influence the care this population receives, and

discussed promising models for payment and delivery-system reforms designed to improve quality and efficiency, as well as to better coordinate services across the continuum of care. Participants also outlined specific, practical strategies that policymakers and government agencies can consider when transitioning from legislative action to implementation so older

Americans benefit directly from innovations in care delivery.
